2. Chain 5 and work 12 dc into the ring.
3. Close the round with a slip stitch in the first dc.
4. Chain 3 and work 2 dc in each dc around.
5. Close the round with a slip stitch in the first dc.
6. Chain 3 and work 3 dc in each dc around.
7. Close the round with a slip stitch in the first dc.
8. Cut the yarn and leave a long tail for sewing.
9. Use the tapestry needle to sew the petals together.

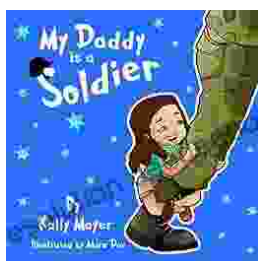
